ACP Alert

The Asian Citrus Psyllid (ACP) has recently been confirmed at a site near your citrus grove(s). You are receiving this notice from the Citrus Pest and Disease Prevention Committee to urge you to treat your citrus with the appropriate pesticide for ACP control. In order to eradicate ACP from your area, pesticide applications in the established treatment zone must occur within a fairly short period of time to prevent ACP establishment.

Your cooperation is essential to controlling the spread of ACP.

The ACP is a vector of huanglongbing (HLB), the most serious citrus disease worldwide. Once a tree is infected with HLB, it will die within about five years. But even before that happens, the fruit fails to ripen and is inedible. HLB has been found in California; therefore controlling the ACP is vital to protecting California's citrus industry. Controlling ACP will slow down or prevent the spread of HLB in your citrus.

Please contact your pest control advisor or your county agricultural commissioner's office for information on pesticides to control the ACP.
